Jaffe and Jacob Jaffe, of Philadelphia, having full faith and confidence that they will perform their duties in accordance with my desires as hereinafter set forth.

THIRD: I further nominate and appoint my said executors to act as co-trustees for such trusts as I hereinafter shall designate.

FOURTH: I devise and bequeath to my beloved son, known as Edward S. Baron, presently residing in England, the sum of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars together with my Morisco-bound Bible now in my library, as a token of my love and affection for him. In this regard, I have taken into consideration the fact that my son is prosperous in his own right, and, therefore, independent

In this regard, I have taken into consideration the fact that my son is prosperous in his own right, and, therefore, does not require any financial token from me.

SEVENTH: I give, devise and bequeath to my Trustees, Robert H. Levy, Jeanette B. Jaffe and Jacob Jaffe, my business in Philadelphia, known as "Levy's International Shrinking Company", with its stock, fixtures, good-will, machinery and assets of whatsoever kind pertaining thereto to hold same in trust for my two children, Emil J. Levy and Jeanette B. Jaffe, with this consideration, however, that my said trustees shall pay to my beloved daughter, Fannie Goldman, as a token of my appreciation for the services she has rendered to me in my lifetime, the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars, which shall be payable out of the proceeds of the said business, in such sums and at such times as my trustees shall deem wise in order that the installments shall not prove too burdensome for the continued preservation of the business. I further desire that when said amount shall finally be fully paid to the said Fannie Goldman in the manner aforesaid, then and in that event, the trust shall terminate and my business, "Levy's International Shrinking Company" shall go to Emil J. Levy and Jeanette B. Jaffe, absolutely, share and share alike.

EIGHTH: I have omitted any bequest to my beloved daughter, Myrtle P. Rosenstein, for the reason that I have provided

my lifetime, having given him my business in Baltimore, which he
now owns and operates.

TENTH: I have further omitted the mention of my
grand-children, having made provision for them in my lifetime by
mentioning them as beneficiaries in policies of insurance which
I have created for that express purpose.

ELEVENTH: All the rest and residue of my estate,
be it real, personal or mixed, of whatsoever kind wheresoever
situate, I give to my children, Robert M. Levy, Jeanette F.
Levy, Myrtle E. Rosenstain, Fannie R. Goldman and Emil M. Levy
share and share alike.

TWELFTH: I hereby nominate and appoint George S.
Pressman, Esquire, as the attorney for my estate and to act in
that capacity in all legal matters pertaining thereto.
